As you can imagine, the Covid-19 global pandemic created significant hardships throughout our community and made it very difficult for people to contribute as they had in the past. Despite the challenges, we were still able to achieve over 80% of our campaign goal. Until this pandemic subsides, all our resources will go towards non-profits and community activities most affected by the pandemic. As always, our priorities are health, income stability and education. We anticipate the 2020-2021 United Way Campaign will be another challenging fund-raising year. We all know that the need is greater than ever. Some of our non-profit partner agencies perform critical functions and they have not been able to fund raise this year. They really need our help. I would like to mention a few businesses for their outstanding fund-raising efforts last year:



- Hallmark Cards- they hosted our campaign kickoff breakfast, and raised \$37,0004.
- Armed Forces Insurance campaign conducted a pace setter campaign and raised over \$27,000 n
